Bacon and Tomato Cups

8 slices of bacon
1 tomato, seeded and chopped
1/2 onion, chopped
3 ounces shredded Swiss cheese
1/2 cup of Mayonnaise
1 teaspoon dried basil
1 16-ounce can refrigerated buttermilk biscuit dough (regular size, not grand's)
Preheat oven 375 degrees. Lightly grease a mini muffin pan.
In a skillet over medium heat, cook bacon until crisp. Drain on paper towels.
Crumble bacon into a medium bowl, and mix tomato, onion, cheese, mayonnaise and basil. Separate biscuits into halves horizontally. Press each half into prepared muffin tin. Fill with the bacon mixture. Bake for 10-12 minutes in the preheated oven or until golden. Repeat with remaining biscuits and filling, Can be baked and reheated.

A Letter to the HOA

Last weekend I was outside in my yard and saw something that could have been very tragic. There were a few children from the neighborhood walking down the street —as they should be able to do safely—this is a subdivision lots of children live here.
